Individual and team approaches pursued in specific project contexts for survey research, definition of research questions, critical analysis, creative problem solving, formulation and evaluation of alternatives, plan making, and development of implementation strategies.
FA 2020; FA 2023	ARCH 240 - Architecture History & Theory I (Origins to 18th century) Undergraduate Architecture Core Course Course Description: This course is an introductory survey of a geographically and temporally broad range of architecture history and theory. Architecture's experiential significance in our present life compels a scholarly understanding of previous cultural, philosophical, political, and social environments, as well as technologies that informed early architects and engineers. Understanding the "why" of the past informs us about architecture as a meaningful artifact and fosters the development of theperiod eye. Lectures, readings, along with virtual and real-world local tours are the basis of course content beginning in the Prehistory period (ca 35,000 BCE) to Modernity (ca 1700 CE).
SPR 2021	CRPL 810 - Qualitative Research Techniques Graduate Level - Planning Core Course Course Description: Development of an understanding and working knowledge of commonly used qualitative analytical techniques used by professionals in the planning process.
