Student Achievement

The mission of the Community and Regional Planning Program (MCRP) is to provide quality education for future professional planners to enable them to pursue careers in government, non-profit organizations, and private practice; and provide research, community outreach, and public service, to foster healthy, sustainable, equitable, and economically viable communities and regions. Student achievements can be measured by the quality of student work, degree completion rates, student employment, and other indicators.

During the past academic year (2019-2020), MCRP students delivered high quality of academic work and made influential impacts on communities in Nebraska. The students in the Planning Studio class, Hazard Mitigation Planning, GIS in Environmental Design and Planning classes directly participated in the flood recovery planning for Winslow, NE and Brownville, NE after the historical flood disaster in March 2019 in Nebraska. The student working products have been used to assist the flood recovery planning process. The students in the Capstone studio class have participated in City of Lincoln's comprehensive plan update. In addition, some students have participated in multiple research projects and contributed to Nebraska's saline wetland conservation planning, transportation planning, historical preservation, and healthy planning in Nebraska.

During the past academic year (2019-2020), 10 students successfully graduated with the MCRP degree and most of them have started their career in planning profession in U.S. and internationally.
